## ADAM S. LURIE

### Lecturer

Mr. Lurie was recently recognized in *Super Lawyers 2013* as “Outstanding” reflecting on a notable career as the top prosecutor for the state of New Jersey, Special Counsel to the US Department of Justice’s Criminal Division, and lead investigator for the US Congress’ House of Representatives Permanent Select Committee.

He holds bar admissions in New York, New Jersey and Washington, DC. Immediately prior to joining Cadwalader, Wickersham, and Taft LLP in 2013, Mr. Lurie served as Senior Counsel to the Assistant Attorney General for Criminal Division in the US Department of Justice (DOJ) where he provided advice to the senior leadership on DOJ’s highest priority white collar crime cases, including matters related to financial fraud, money laundering, asset forfeiture, health care fraud, and food and drug administration matters.

Prior to his assignment in DOJ’s top prosecutorial unit, Mr. Lurie served as the Assistant United States Attorney for the state of New Jersey. While serving as the AUSA, he was appointed by the then US Attorney to the elite political corruption, securities and health care fraud unit. Rounding out his career in public service, Mr. Lurie served as the lead investigator and Staff Director for the US House of Representatives Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence where he oversaw congressional hearings and inquiries on federal contracting, cyber security matters, and the Office of Foreign Assets Control sanctions.

2010 – 2012, Senior Counsel to the Assistant Attorney General (AAG), Criminal Division, at the US DOJ.

2005 – 2009, Assistant United States Attorney in Newark, New Jersey, where he worked with the elite securities and health care fraud and political corruption units.

111th Congress (2009 – 2010), Staff Director for investigations and oversight on the U.S. House of Representatives Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence.

He successfully tried numerous complex cases, including the conviction, after an 11-week jury trial, of the Chairman of the New Jersey Senate Budget Committee and a New Jersey medical school dean on pension fraud and corruption charges, and handled some of the Office’s most significant FCPA, securities, corporate fraud, health care fraud and FDA, and corruption matters.
