PROF. LEONOR M. BRIONES is currently the President of Social Watch Philippines, Inc.

She is a Professor Emeritus and former Director for Policy and Executive Development at National College of Public Administration and Governance, University of the Philippines (UP), Diliman Campus. She also served as Vice President for Finance and Administration of the University of the Philippines.

She held various posts outside the academe, heading the Bureau of Treasury from August 1998 to February 2001 and serving as Presidential Adviser for Social Development with Cabinet Rank under the Office of the President and as Secretary to the Commission on Audit.

Prof. Briones is an Independent Director at Megawide Construction Corporation since July 19, 2010, an Independent Director of Greenery Holdings Incorporated since 2011 and Director of AgriNurture, Inc. from 2008 to October 3, 2012.

Prof. Briones obtained her Bachelor's degree in Business Administration, major in Accounting from Siliman University where she presently serves as Chair of the University Board of Trustees. She obtained her Master's degree in Public Administration, major in Local Government and Fiscal Administration from UP Diliman, and her Post Graduate Diploma in Development Administration, major in Public Enterprises and Certificate in Policy for Public Enterprise from the Harvard Institute for International Development, Harvard University, Massachusetts, USA.



MR. VINCENT T. LAZATIN is the current chairman of the Civil Society Coalition for the UN Convention against Corruption, based in Berlin, Germany. He is also the Executive Director of Transparency and Accountability Network (TAN), a network of 34 civil society organizations, non-governmental organizations, and academic and research institutions focusing on transparency and accountability in governance. He has been with the Network since March 2001.

Mr. Lazatin is also the executive director of Bantay Lansangan, a partnership with the Department of Work and Highways. He is concurrently a member of the Board of Trustees of pagbabago@pilipinas, a network of individuals working for long-term, lasting change in the Philippines. He sits as the civil society representative in the Department of Health's Integrity Development Committee, and the Vice-Chairperson of the UNESCO Information for All Program, among others.

Mr. Lazatin is co-convenor of the Access to Information Network, a loose network of right to information advocates. Immediately prior to becoming the full time Executive Director of TAN in June 2006, Mr. Lazatin spent 17 and a half years in the fund advisory industry, both in the Philippines and in the United States, and most recently with The Mutual Fund Management Company of the Philippines.

Mr. Lazatin is the civil society representative on the Construction Sector Transparency (CoST) Initiative Interim Board and Chairman of the Philippines' CoST Multi-Stakeholder Group. Mr. Lazatin was recently elected to the Board of Trustees of the Galing Pook Foundation.



MS. MALOU C. MANGAHAS is a veteran of Philippine journalism and multi-tasking. She edited the *Philippine Collegian* and later presided over the University of the Philippines Student Council while working on a journalism degree, graduating cum laude.

Ms. Mangahas is recently the recipient of the Marshall Macluhan fellowship sponsored by the Canadian Embassy. She is also a fellow of the Sandra Burton Nieman Foundation for Journalism at Harvard University.

Ms. Mangahas has worked for various newspapers and news agencies based in Manila and overseas. She started as a beat reporter for national broadsheets during the Marcos regime before being appointed as editor-in-chief of the Manila Times. Later, she would become the senior correspondent of Reuters news agency in Manila.

She is co-founder and currently the executive director of the Philippine Center for Investigative Journalism. Her body of work dealt largely on the topic of corruption.

Until recently, Ms. Mangahas was the editor in chief of gmanews.tv, while working as Vice President for Research and Content Development of GMA News and Public Affairs, on top of conducting training seminars for the network's journalists.

MR. DAVID M. CELDRAN is a Philippine broadcast journalist and producer. He is Director for Current Affairs and Television Production of the ABS-CBN News Channel, responsible for the programming and production of the channel's talk and debate programs. He is also a contributor and senior anchorperson for the network. In addition, he is currently the Chair of the Board of Editors of the Philippine Center for Investigative Journalism (PCIJ).
