Cristina Jayme Montiel is professor of political and peace psychology at the Ateneo de Manila University's Department of Psychology. She like-wise heads the Socio-Political Research Unit of the Ateneo Center for Social Policy and Public Affairs. Montiel chairs the Political Psychology Commit-tee of the Psychological Association of the Philippines, is associate editor of Peace and Conflict: Journal of Peace Psychology, and sits as a board mem-ber of the Division of Political Psychology of the International Association of Applied Psychology. He became the first highest-paid gov-ernor in the country, courtesy of the LINGKOD BAYAN Presidential Award of the Civil Service Commission. Atty. Barbo is also a member of the ex-detaineees organization Samahan ng mga Exdetainees Laban sa Detensyon at para sa Amnestiya (SELDA) and he was one of the original claimants in the Marcos Estate case at Honolulu, Hawaii. As of this writing, he continues to be a practicing attorney and human rights lawyer.

Nereus Acosta is Representative of the First District of Bukidnon serv-ing a second term in Congress and is at present Liberal Party Vice-President for Mindanao. In 1995 he was elected with the widest margin of votes to the Provincial Board of Bukidnon where he served as Minority Floor Leader. He obtained his PhD in Government and Political Science from the University of Hawaii as an East-West Center Doctorate Scholar. He teaches public policy at the Ateneo, University of the Philippines, and Xavier University, continues to work with NGOs in Bukidnon and hosts radio shows on public affairs. He is the principal author of the 1999 Clean Air Act and several other environ-mental measures.
